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# Access - Equity - Quality

- By Statute
  - All high schools required to offer at least
    - 2 dual credit courses *and*
    - 2 AP courses
  - Dual credit programs w/high school teachers
    - NACEP accredited *or*
    - CHE review process
- Addressing teacher credentialing challenge



# Funding

- Student and Institutional Incentives
  - Rate charged to **students** for priority liberal arts and Career and Technical Education (CTE) – not to exceed \$25 per credit hour
  - Reimbursement for **post-secondary provider** - \$50 per credit hour
  - Free Tuition
    - Free and Reduced Lunch students
    - Ivy Tech Community College courses



# Transferability/Applicability

## Dual Credit Priority Liberal Arts Course List

- Core Transfer Library (CTL) Courses
  - General Education Courses
- Transferable
  - CTL – course-to-course
  - STGEC – general education core
- Applicable
  - Courses that count toward degrees and completion

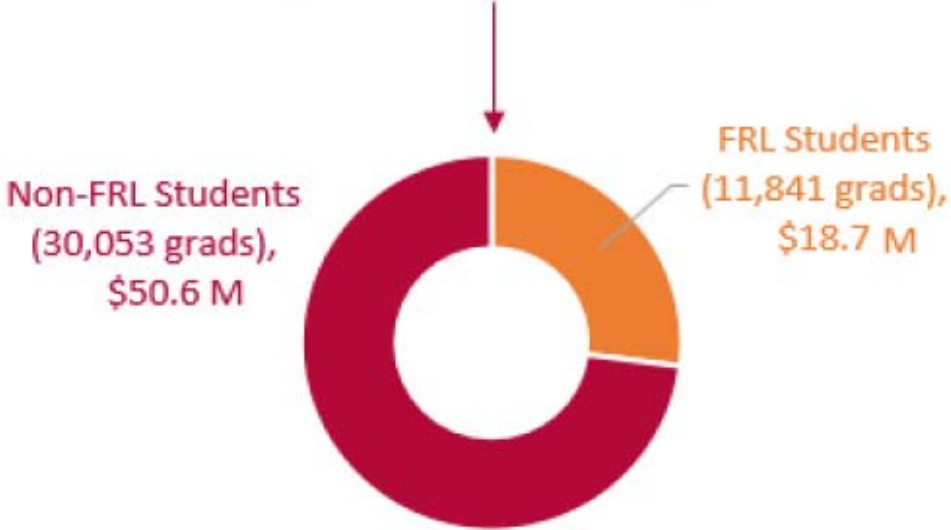


# Outcomes

- Dual credit participation and Early College High School programs are growing
  - 64% of all students graduate with dual credit
  - Underrepresented students
- Students outperform their peers
  - College enrollment
  - Persistence
  - On-time Graduation
